Paraphrasing

Using your own words to describe something you've read. It can be about the same length or even longer than the original passage. Paraphrasing is used for the following reasons:

- to restate a difficult passage the reader may not understand,
- to explain or interpret concepts or unfamiliar terms,
- or to make abstract facts and ideas concrete.

1. How Do We Do It?

Steps:

- 1. Read the passage carefully
- 2. Decide the main ideas of the passage
- 3. Highlight important words or phrases
- 4. Put the main points in your own words.

Tips:

- 1. Replace synonyms.
- 2. Use different words.
- Make a different sentences.
 But the Same Meaning.

2. Example A: Sentence

2-1. Original:

Giraffes like Acacia leaves and hay and they can consume 75 pounds of food a day.

Paraphrase:

A giraffe can eat up to 75 pounds of Acacia leaves and hay every day.

2-2. Original:

Any trip to Italy should include a visit to Tuscany to sample their exquisite wines.

Paraphrase:

Be sure to include a Tuscan wine-tasting experience when visiting Italy.

3. Example B: Passage

Original:

At just 8.5 square miles, the Pacific island country of Nauru is one of the smallest countries in the world. The island was once rich in phosphate, but most of the resource has been mined leaving damage to the environment behind. Nauru has a population of about 10,000 people.

Paraphrase:

Nauru is a Pacific island country that is only 8.5 square miles in area. It is one of the smallest countries on the planet and only about 10,000 people live there. Nauru has mined its once plentiful supplies of phosphate. This has damaged the environment on the island.
