li-chee /'litʃi/ n. [C] another spelling of LYCHEE
li-chen /'laɪkən/ n. [C,U] a gray, green, or yellow plant that spreads over the surface of stones and trees—compare MOSS

Lich-ten-stein /'liktonstain, -,stin/, Roy /roi/ (1923-1997) a U.S. PAINTER and SCULPTOR famous for his work in POP ART, especially paintings in the style of COMIC STRIPS

lic-it /'lisit/ adj. FORMAL legal: licit drugs —opposite ILLICIT

lick1 /lik/ v.

1 tongue [T] to move your tongue across the surface of something in order to eat it, clean it etc.: Paul put down the chicken and licked his fingers.



2 defeat [T] INFORMAL to defeat an opponent or solve a problem: *Manley has been unable to lick his drinking problem*

3 flames/waves [I,T] LITERARY if flames or waves lick something, they touch it again and again with quick movements: [+ at/against] Flames licked at the top story of the eight-floor building.

4 lick your lips/chops INFORMAL to feel eager and excited because you are expecting something good: Executives were licking their chops at the prospect of the merger.

5 lick your wounds to quietly think about the defeat or disappointment you have just suffered: *The day after the election, many defeated conservatives were licking their wounds.*

6 lick sb's boots DISAPPROVING to obey someone
